Youth Dairy Cattle Department Rules

This department (EXCLUDING MCF Futurity Heifers Division 3100) is open to all youth residents in Arizona.

ENTRY INTO THIS DEPARTMENT, USE: FORM - B

If an entry is received incomplete, the fair office will return the entry to the exhibitor. The entry will be accepted if completed and received in the fair office ALONG WITH A \$25 PROCESSING FEE within 10 days of request. If not received with the processing fee or received after the 10 days, the entry will not be accepted. A copy of the Seasonal Pass must accompany entry form. Use a separate entry form for each Breed, Registered, or Grade animal. Entry forms with fees must be received in the Fair Office no later than the entry deadline. Postmarks are NOT accepted. Weigh-In - Entries in the Maricopa County Futurity Program must weigh-in Tuesday, April 14th from 7pm-8pm

SHOWMANSHIP: Clipping ~ Wednesday, April 15th, 8am-6:00pm. All animals to be used in showmanship **MUST** be clipped at the fair on Wednesday, 8am-6pm except for the head which may be clipped at home.

Showmanship judging Friday, April 17, 10:00am.

JUDGING: Thursday, April 16th, 2:00 pm -

Separate classes by breed

HERDSMANSHIP: Areas will be checked periodically by a committee. Points will be given daily. Awards may not be presented if the committee finds lack of effort by exhibitors or if it is necessary for Fair crews to clean. Awards will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Cleanliness of animals and pens.
- Neatness and cleanliness of stalls and alleys.
- Creative use of educational materials and special displays.
- Courtesy to Judges and fair officials.
- Courtesy to fair visitors and other exhibitors.

DAIRY CATTLE EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

- All animals must be kept in livestock area.
- Sign in time will be posted at dairy office.
- Animals in Division 3100 are eligible to sell at Auction
- Maricopa County Fair Dress Code required. *Refer to Livestock Rules - #25* **NOTE:** in addition, 4H and Open Youth **MUST** wear white pants.
- Registered animals must be in the exhibitor's name by entry deadline.
- Bring proper documentation to receiving. **Veterinarian Health Inspection papers** and hauling papers are required for all dairy animals exhibiting at the Fair.
- The Dairy Cattle veterinarian reserves the right to require re-tests after entries are on the grounds, or to order removal from the grounds of any animal(s) not meeting the health requirements or showing signs of illness.
- The Show Ring Code of Ethics* will be followed while at the fair, including conduct in and around the ring and barns before and after the classes have shown. Violations of any kind of the following items will result in forfeiture of all prizes and awards and other disciplinary action by fair management, state and national breed associations. Unethical and unacceptable practices or procedures include:
 - Any alteration of appearance, physical change by removal or injection, including the use of paint, powder, dye or artificial color, etc., is strictly prohibited.
 - Misrepresenting the age and/or the milking status of an animal.
 - Unnatural udder balancing.
 - Setting the teats (mechanical or chemical preparation).
 - Treating any part of the body (internally or externally) with any substance or method to

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mask deformities, weaknesses, or produce unnatural animation.

- f. Unnatural surgery performed to change the natural appearance.
- g. Insertion of foreign material.
- h. Changing the color of hair at any point, spot or area.
- i. Use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or given as a drench.
- j. Administration of a drug which affects circulatory, respiratory or central nervous system of an animal, except for treating a recognized disease or injury.
- k. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or any other conduct detrimental to the show will also result in award forfeiture.

8. Raffles or charging to pet any animals is prohibited.
9. Stall assignments will be posted on receiving day.

DIVISION 3100: MCF Futurity Program

Exhibitor responsibilities:

1. Purchase by January 17, 2009 a Registered or Quality Grade Holstein or Jersey heifer. Animal should be born from March 1st to May 31st of previous year.
2. Submit entry for proposed animal to be sold at the 2009 Maricopa County Fair, by the January 12th deadline. Entry must include three colored pictures of project: 1 front view - 1 right side - 1 left side. All photos should also include exhibitor.
3. Animals will be sold by the pound.
4. Exhibitor is responsible for providing proper care and nutrition for the animal. If animal is not in good dairy condition, it will NOT be allowed to show or sell in the auction. Exhibitor is encouraged to contact a local Maricopa County dairyman for "tips" on appropriate care and maintenance of project.
5. To prepare heifer for dairy life - the animal should be raised with other cattle. (heifers and cows)

DIVISION 3113: AZ State Fair Jersey Futurity Program

Exhibitor must enter by Feb. 27th deadline, even though they do not yet have their heifers. Animals will be classed at fair. Complete form B. Exhibitor must also enter showmanship at this time.

DIVISION 3114: Family ~ Dairy Beef

This is a dairy project so all animals must be clipped as a dairy animal. NO BULLS, no horns. Must be 90 days old. All weights, no auction. Animals will be divided into weight classes if needed.

DIVISION 9999: Dairy Fitting and Showmanship

Official Dress Required. No animal may be used by more than one exhibitor in any event. Exhibitors must train, fit, clip, clean and show their own entry. Animals may not be clipped, except heads and ears, within the twenty (20) days before the Fair. Nose tongs will not be permitted due to public animal welfare concerns. This applies to all animals being fitted at the fair.
