ENTRY INTO THIS DEPARTMENT USE: FORM L

All entries for **Market Swine** must be **received** in the Fair Office no later than Noon, January 17, 2009. (Postmarks not accepted.) Online entries will be accepted until midnight 1/17/09. Include entry form, a copy of Arizona State Certification of Swine Inspection from Livestock Inspector, color photo of exhibitor with pig showing $\frac{3}{4}$ front view (not to exceed 4" x 5"), **ALL** signatures and entry fees. **If an entry is received incomplete, the fair office will return the entry to the exhibitor. The entry will be accepted if completed and received in the fair office ALONG WITH A \$25 PROCESSING FEE within 10 days of request. If not received with the processing fee or received after the 10 days, the entry will not be accepted.** Mail or deliver completed entries to: Maricopa County Fair, 1826 W. McDowell Rd., Phoenix.

WEIGH - IN: Swine Superintendent will assign receiving time to each club. All animals must be identified by exhibitor, parent, leader or advisor at receiving. **Identification of owner and animal is final.** Bring breed registration papers to weigh-in. At receiving, all swine must be groomed so that all breed characteristics are visible. The Superintendent and Breed

Classifiers have the right to request an animal be washed before it is classified.

Mandatory exhibitor's meeting, Tuesday, April 14, 2009, 6 pm.

Exhibitor does not have to be present if parent, leader or advisor from group or club is in attendance as representative.

JUDGING: Wednesday, April 15, 2009, 10:00am.

SHOWMANSHIP: Thursday, April 16, 2009, following the Goat show, approx. 3:00pm.

SWINE EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

1. **All animals must be kept in livestock area. Any exhibitor found with their animal outside livestock area will not be allowed to participate in the auction.**
2. Maricopa County Fair Dress Code required. *Refer to Livestock Rules - #25*
3. This show is a market breed show. Classes will be determined after weigh-in by a certified classifier. Only Barrows and Gilts can be shown. No boars and bred gilts.
4. Entries must show individual identification using an ear notch that conforms to the universal ear notch system plus the premises ID number using a tattoo or tamper proof ear tag that conforms to the USDA. All pigs **must** have in possession an Arizona State Office Certificate of Swine Inspection. To arrange for a certificate of swine inspection - contact the Department of Agriculture, 602-542-0872
5. Weight for swine is minimum - 215 lbs. minimum and maximum - 280 lbs. Entries less than 215 lbs. or more than 280 lbs. not accepted. (Auctioned animals will be paid up to 260 lbs.) *If an animal is not between 215-280 pounds, animal may go home as it comes off scale, or it may be kept at the fair to be shown for showmanship.
6. ALL exhibitors must keep animals, stalls, tack pens and walkways presentable the entire duration of the Fair. Pens MUST be cleaned and feed/water pans removed from pens NO LATER than 10am. NO EXCEPTIONS. Exhibitors failing to provide proper care and maintenance of their animals, through the duration of the Fair, will have \$20 per day, deducted from their premium checks. In the event an exhibitor does not participate in the auction, future entry into the Maricopa County Fair will be denied until fee is paid. (this fee is placed into the Auction Support Fund)
7. Belt buckles will be awarded to each breed and reserve champion. Overall grand and reserve grand champions of the show will receive buckles and banners.
8. The state Veterinarian may declare the show terminal if a Pseudo rabies outbreak occurs.

DIVISION 9999: Showmanship

Exhibitors must show their own animal.

100	Junior Novice: Junior member - first year project*
101	Junior: 9yrs -12yrs prior to Jan. 1, 2009
102	Intermediate Novice: Intermediate member - first year project*
103	Intermediate: 13yrs -15yrs prior to Jan. 1, 2009
104	Senior Novice: Senior member - first year project*
105	Senior: 16yrs -18yrs prior to Jan. 1, 2009

Winners of novice division have the option to show in non-novice division. Winners from class 101, 103, 105 will represent the Swine Department in the **Round Robin Showmanship Contest Friday, April 17, 2009 at 5:00pm.**

BREED CHARACTERISTICS:

Berkshire:

1. A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire character.
2. A Berkshire must have white on all four legs, face and tail (unless tail is docked).
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid white or a solid black face from the ears forward.
5. A Berkshire must NOT have a solid black nose (rim of nose).
6. White is allowed on the ears, but NO solid white may appear on the ears.
7. Occasional splash of white may appear on the body.

Chester White:

1. Must possess Chester White Breed Character.
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.

4. Ears must be down and medium size.

5. Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such ear tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

Crossbred:

If pig is entered as a crossbred, it will show as a crossbred.

Duroc:

1. Must be red in color and possess Duroc Breed Character. (ears must be down and medium size).
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT have any white hair located on the animal.
4. Must NOT have any black hair.
5. Must NOT have more than three black spots on the skin and none of these spots can be larger than two inches in diameter.
6. Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.

Hampshire:

1. Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may partially or totally encircle the body.
2. Must possess Hampshire Breed Character (ears must be erect and not rounded).
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
5. Must NOT have any red hair.

Landrace:

1. Must be white in color and possess Landrace Breed Character (ears must be down).
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT allow any color hair other than white.
4. Must NOT allow more than three spots of skin pigmentation.
5. Must NOT allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter.

Poland China:

1. Must possess Poland China Breed Character.
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must be black with six white points (face, feet and tail) with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog may not possess more than one black leg and be determined as a Poland China. (Tail docking is permissible eliminating that white point.)
4. Must have ears down.
5. Must NOT have evidence of belt formation.
6. Cannot have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
7. Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of tampering with possible ear tags are ineligible.

Spotted Swine:

1. Must be black and white in color.
2. Must possess Spotted Breed Character.
3. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
4. Ears must not be erect.
5. Any red tinted or sandy brown spots are ineligible.
6. No solid black head from ears forward.
7. No distinct white belt pattern (hair or skin) encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.

Yorkshire:

1. Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire Breed Character (ears must be erect).
2. Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
3. Must NOT have any colored hair other than white.
4. Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted silver dollar.
5. Must NOT have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.
